The NPS installation at Wind Cave near Hot Springs, S.D., sent this hide. The hide had been treated without the hair being removed.

Davidson said there are now several herds of buffalo that occasionally need to be thinned. Some buffalo are now located north of Pueblo and a few more near Fowler. It is possible that if some herds need to be reduced in size to fit the available range there would be some hides.

A bale of buffalo hides would add considerably to the authenticity of Bent's Old Fort. Such hides formed a large part of the trade at the fort in the old days.
