Subject: Information sheet on Hoverweep

We received Mr. Evison's memorandum of December 8 on this subject just after finally running off a few hundred copies of the mine ographed two-page leaflet on Hovenweep, as revised. Two copies have already been forwarded to your office.

The leaflet is, as Mr. Evison mentions, headed "United States Department of the Interior - National Park Service" (in capital letters), and in the text reference is made to "Mesa Verde National Park" as well as to "Hovenweep National Menument," so that it should be clear to the reader that Hovenweep National Monument is administered by the National Park Service. Undoubtedly, however, it would be desirable to have a more or less standardized beginning statement, in this and other similar leaflets, to the effect that "Hovenweep National Monument, set aside by presidential proclamation in 1923 to protect and preserve its unique archeological remains, is one of the numerous historical areas of the National Park System. Administered by the United States Department of the Interior through the National Park Service, it is * * * " The heading would then be unnecessary, perhaps, and the sheet could be headed simply "Hovenweep Mational Monument" in capitals.

In the case of Hovenweep for the present, as well as for Yucca House and Gila Cliff Dwellings, we do not wish to encourage travel and consequently no sketch-maps or exact road directions are given.

These additions can, however, be made at once, and the current revised edition discarded, if that is considered advisable. The inquiry in Mr. Evison's final paragraph regarding quantities used of such mimeographed leaflets will be taken up in a separate memorandum.
